


# MAI-CoC Grantees by Region

# Medicaid Expansion & MAI-CoC Grantees

## Current Status of State Medicaid Expansion Decisions



NOTES: Current status for each state is based on KCMU tracking and analysis of state executive activity. \*\*MT has passed legislation adopting the expansion; it requires federal waiver approval. \*AR, IA, IN, MI, PA and NH have approved Section 1115 waivers. Coverage under the PA waiver went into effect 1/1/15, but it is transitioning coverage to a state plan amendment. WI covers adults up to 100% FPL in Medicaid, but did not adopt the ACA expansion.

# Other Grantee Demographic Data

- Most projects (31) are primarily serving urban areas
- Three projects (3) are primarily serving rural areas
- Target populations include: American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN); LGBT populations; men who have sex with men (MSM); Asian and Pacific Islanders; Black and African Americans; Latino/a; Hispanic; Veterans; low socio-economic status; foreign-born ethnic and racial minorities
