

## CALL FOR 2014 PBHCI GRANTEE PRESENTATIONS

### ABSTRACTS DUE BY: June 6, 2014

SAMHSA funded Primary and Behavioral Health Care Integration (PBHCI) grantees are at the forefront of developing systems of integration for adults with serious mental illness. The required annual meeting is an opportunity for all currently funded PBHCI organizations and their primary care partners to share their initiatives, operations, outcomes, and challenges with a broader audience of fellow grantees. The upcoming meeting will feature selected grantees to present on a variety of topics in 60 or 90 minute workshops. In order to accommodate as many grantee presenters as possible, we may ask that you be part of a panel presentation.

### REASONS TO PRESENT:

- Influence and enhance primary and behavioral health care integration nationally
- An opportunity to showcase your organization and your successful outcomes
- An opportunity to share both your best practices and your challenges with fellow grantees

### ABSTRACT REQUIREMENTS:

- **Must be related to your PBHCI project**
- **Must be approved and submitted through your Project Director**
- Abstract/Session Title
- Session Type (individual presentation or panel presentation)
- Technical Level (Introductory, Intermediate, Advanced)
- Session Abstract (600 characters max)
- What Problems / Challenges Will be Addressed? (400 character limit)
- What Results / Benefits Were Realized? (400 character limit)
- Track (see below for tracks)
- What Is Your Project Role?
- Describe Your Discipline (Nurse Practitioner, Social Worker, Peer Specialist, etc.)
- Visual Materials such as power point or video, or experiential exercises to be used
- Presenter / Co-Presenter(s) (name, email address, grantee cohort and organization required)
- Handouts

### SELECTION CRITERIA:

A planning committee comprised of SAMHSA GPOs, grantee volunteers, and CIHS staff will review abstracts and select presentations. Presentations will be selected based on the proposed contribution to the integration learning community.

**2014 CONFERENCE PRESENTATION TOPIC IDEAS:**

- Integrated care operations ( e.g., sharing health information, enrollment & reassessment, care coordination)
- Telehealth
- Primary care and psychiatry — disease management
- Wellness or prevention activities (including tobacco cessation, exercise, wellness groups)
- Workforce development (e.g., training peer specialists, nurse care coordinators, PCPs in behavioral healthcare)
- Addressing health disparities (e.g., grantees who having developed programming for a subset of their consumers, such as a particular racial/ethnic group known to have a higher health risk of diabetes)
- Quality improvement activities (e.g., collecting and using data to inform care/ health registries)
- Challenges and successes of integration partnerships
- Sustainability (billing and finance)
- Role-based focused: Peer Specialists, Nurse Care Managers, CEOs, Project Directors, Primary Care Partners, Evaluators, or Wellness Coordinators
