Financing integrated healthcare is one of the key challenges encountered by organizations during implementation of services. This webinar will feature the state based **Interim Billing and Financial Worksheets** developed by the SAMHSA-HRSA Center for Integrated Health Solutions. The worksheets identify the major CMHC and Health Center CPT codes used for billing integrated health services and their availability for use in each of the 50 states. The webinar will address the core aspects of billing for integrated health services and assist participants in successfully using the worksheets to maximize billing opportunities for integrated health services.

Participants will:

- Learn about financial viability and sustainability of integration efforts through appropriate and accurate billing for services.
- Understand how state Medicaid programs determine the types of services, codes, and individuals credentialed to provide services, resulting in unique billing rules and regulations in each state.
- Get familiar with CPT codes that can be used to bill for services and the discipline and credentials required by the public funding source (i.e., Medicare, Medicaid) to bill for the codes.
