A policies, systems, and environmental (PSE) change approach is a new way of thinking about how to effectively improve health in a community. It includes strategies such as developing protocols and procedures to guide or influence behavior; changing the social norms of an organization; and altering the physical, social, or economic factors designed to influence behavior. Given today's climate of diminishing resources, it is also a vital strategy in terms of sustaining wellness efforts. This month's grantee webinar will feature Carolyn Jenkins, DrPH, RD, LD, APRN-BC-ADM, FAAN, Professor at the Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. She is involved with the *REACH U.S. SouthEastern African American Center of Excellence for Eliminating Disparities related to Diabetes and its Complications* ([REACH U.S. SEA-CEED](#)), a community based participatory action partnership working together to decrease disparities for diabetes and its complications. Dr. Jenkins will describe her work with REACH U.S. SEA-CEED as well as provide practical PSE strategies grantees can use in their own work with diabetes prevention and control. Topics including leveraging community partnerships and improving cultural competency will be discussed.

Please join The Smoking Cessation Leadership Center (SCLC) next webinar, *Recovery, Social Rehabilitation, and Living Tobacco Free*. Dori S. Hutchinson, Sc.D., Director of Services, Center for Psychiatric Rehabilitation at Boston University, and Associate Clinical Professor at Sargent College of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences at Boston University will present. The webinar objectives are:

- Provide a brief overview of the toll of tobacco among those with serious mental illness
- Discuss a framework for recovery
- Explain strategies to assess and develop readiness for recovery and social rehabilitation
- Describe the importance of the role of peers in tobacco cessation
- Study real life case studies
